By utilizing the common components used across the UOW website, each suggested change refers to an example, recommending that the content be organized or displayed in a similar fashion.

Following the details of suggested changes, a section on future planning offers some advice on the future maintenance of the website.

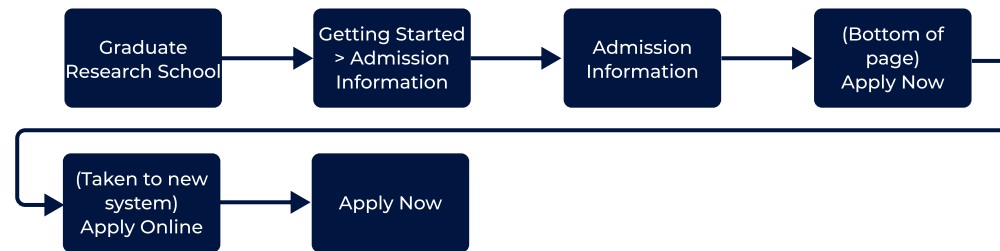
Site Analysis

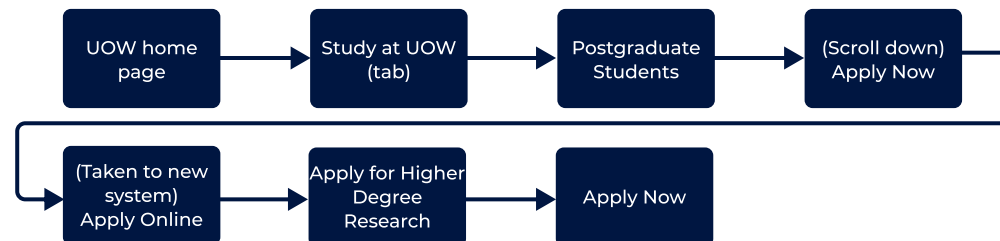

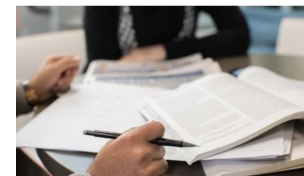

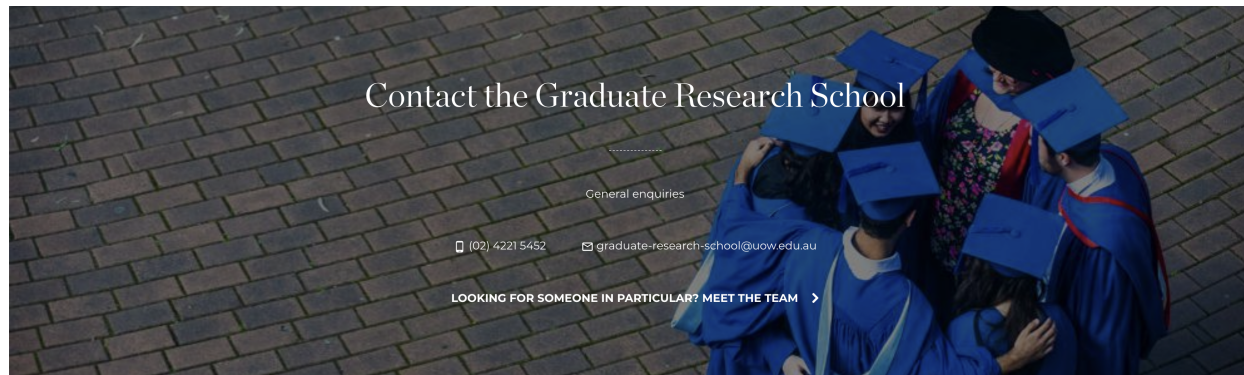

#3 Move 'International and Domestic Postgraduate Tuition Awards and Fee Offsets' to Enrolment Management page

The 'International and Domestic Postgraduate Tuition Awards and Fee Offsets' section on the 'Frequently Asked Questions' page to be relocated on the 'Enrolment Management' page. This information is important for students to find, and so should be easier to locate.

International and Domestic Postgraduate Tuition Awards and Fee Offsets



The following arrangements apply to all higher degree by research students commencing in 2020 onwards.

International Postgraduate Tuition Awards for international HDR students:

1. The duration of a full course International Postgraduate Tuition Award (IPTA) aligns with the standard course duration of the HDR program.
The maximum term for all new full course IPTAs is:
2. Masters by Research – 2 years full time or 4 years part time
3. Doctorate by Research – 4 years full time or 8 years part time
4. Eligible students can apply for Sessional IPTAs in two rounds each year
5. Students are eligible to receive a Sessional IPTA for a **maximum of one session** only
6. For students with existing International Postgraduate Tuition Awards (IPTA) please refer to your original scholarship offer letter as the duration advised in your offer letter will remain unchanged.






Research Training Program (RTP) fee offsets for domestic HDR students:

1. The duration of a Research Training Program (RTP) Fee Offset aligns with the standard course duration of the HDR program. The maximum term for the RTP Fee offset is:
2. Masters by Research – 2 years full time or 4 years part time
3. Doctorate by Research – 4 years full time or 8 years part time

Annual progress reports

Purpose of Annual Progress Report (APR)

The Annual Progress Report is the means by which the University assesses whether the student candidature will continue into the following year. Written reports from students and their supervisors are an important and formal means to monitor research student progress.

- Each report should be a frank appraisal of the student's progress by both the supervisor and the student.
- The annual report is the means by which the University assesses whether the candidature will continue into the following year.
- The Progress Report form will also provide an opportunity for you to check and update if necessary the details pertaining to your full-time/part-time status, your thesis title, and your supervisor.

One warning rule:

HDR Students who do not complete section 1 or 3 of the APR by the due dates noted below will be given **one written warning**. Those students who have not completed Section 1 or 3 by due date **will have their candidature discontinued**. Re-enrolment once discontinued, may only be possible by submitting a new application for admission through the online application process. Approval for admission in these cases will be at the Faculty's discretion.

Biyearly Maintenance

It is suggested that the site be checked twice a year at the end of each semester (date TBC within the team).

These changes are then to be implemented promptly, to ensure current and prospective candidates are receiving up-to-date information.

Other Suggestions

Whilst in discussion with the broader GRS team, some other suggestions for website uplift were noted. The main one being to split the entire site for Students and Supervisors. This would make the site easier to navigate for both parties, however would be a lengthy process to implement.

Some other minor suggestions are listed below:

- Include icons and pictograms that help a user to navigate the site quickly
- Use relevant imagery for the content
- Minimize information where possible
- Keep important links or information at the top of a page.

Conclusion

With the application and management of enrolment processes happening online, it is important that candidates are able to find current and clear information. The site may require a small uplift to raise its standards but the important part is maintaining the site in the future.
